I understand that the Castle Rock hike is a challenging 2.5-mile hike at 4,000-foot elevation. The view overlooks the Tule Lake basin and the concentration camp site. I understand it requires an 800-foot climb to the top that is dusty and unshaded, with a steep section on loose rocks where I could easily fall and injure myself. I may put myself at risk if I have chronic medical conditions that may be affected by strenuous physical exertion, heat exhaustion or altitude. Also, I understand this activity is not recommended for children under 10 years of age.

I understand the need to wear hiking boots or shoes with good support, and that if I do not have proper footwear or attire, I will not be permitted on the hike. I am in excellent physical condition with no pre-existing medical conditions that might put my health at risk under these strenuous physical conditions. I do not have any physical or medical conditions that could lead to dizziness, fainting, cardiac events, falls or other injury. In previous years, a few hikers experienced extreme fatigue and suffered heart and diabetes-related problems that have required medical transport. I understand that were I to experience such an event, medical treatment may not be readily accessible.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Section 1: Registration – Procedures and Form

1. Does every participant have to fill out a registration form?

Yes. We require a separate registration form for every participant – including children and infants. Registration forms with more than one name will be returned as incomplete.

2. Can I place a request to hold a space without submitting a registration form and submitting a payment?

No. Due to the expected heavy interest for the 2020 Tule Lake Pilgrimage, we cannot hold spaces. The only way to “hold” a space is by submitting a completed registration package with the payment.

3. May I send in my registration form via Federal Express or some other express shipping company?

Yes. Please be sure to include the email address tulelakeregistrar@gmail.com on the delivery status so that we will know your envelope is coming. **Please be sure to mark the envelope “NO SIGNATURE REQUIRED” as there will be no one to sign for it at the time of delivery.**

4. What does “Bus Location” mean?

The locations listed on the registration form are where the buses will pick up and drop off Pilgrimage attendees. Some of these locations are churches and some are shopping centers. The tentative locations are: CALIFORNIA: Sacramento Betsuin, Sacramento Airport, Berkeley BART Station, San Francisco Japantown, San Jose Japantown, and Union City; OREGON: Portland and Eugene; WASHINGTON: Seattle (Nisei Vet Hall) and Olympia. These locations are subject to change. You will be notified of your assigned bus location in the information packet that we will send to you by June 2020 (see Section 3: Buses/Transportation).

5. Why must I enter a 1st and 2nd choice for my bus location? I have attended the Pilgrimage before, and I only had to check one box.

Depending on the receipt date of your registration package, it could be that your first choice for a bus location is full. With your stating a 2nd choice on your Registration Form, we may be able to assign you to another bus that has available space. We understand that it may be inconvenient for you to have to travel to another bus location. Unfortunately, we are limited to the number of participants based on bus capacity.

6. Can I join the Pilgrimage for only part of the schedule and pay a reduced rate? Can I “drop by” the Pilgrimage without registering at all?

No. Those who are not registered and who show up at Oregon Institute of Technology (OIT) or one of the other sites will be asked to leave.

Section 1: Registration – Procedures and Form (Continued)

7. What is the refund policy if I cancel?

If you cancel on or before April 30, 2020, we will refund your payment, less a \$50 processing fee. If you cancel between May 1, 2020, and May 31, 2020, we will refund your payment, less a \$250 processing fee. Unfortunately, no refunds will be sent for any cancellations received after May 31, 2020.

8. If I change my mind about attending the Pilgrimage and cancel, can I transfer my space to someone else who has not yet registered?

No. Once a registrant cancels his/her registration, that vacancy will be filled with an individual on the Pilgrimage Wait List. This also applies to spaces in the Village Apartments (see Housing).

9. Will you send me a confirmation of registration?

Yes. We will send registration confirmations via e-mail or by USPS. If you do not have your own email address, we recommend you list an email address of a friend or relative. Email will help us expedite communications with you and save the Committee postage expenses. To prevent our emails from going to your junk mail folder, add the Tule Lake Pilgrimage email address to your contact list. tulelakeregistrar@gmail.com.

10. When will I receive more information on the Pilgrimage?

Those who are selected to attend the Pilgrimage will receive a detailed packet with additional information prior to June 2020. This packet will include departure instructions and times, parking for the weekend, and what to bring. Additional information may also come via email from the assigned bus monitor.

11. If I am on the Pilgrimage Wait List, what chance do I have of making the final roster?

Once the bus limits have been reached, the first few applicants will be placed on the Wait Lists by locations. If we receive your Registration Form and payment after the Wait Lists are filled, we will return your check.

12. Will you be providing updates on the status of registration (e.g., how many spaces are filled by a particular date)?

Yes. We will be posting regular updates on both our website (www.tulelake.org) and on the Tule Lake Pilgrimage Facebook page.

13. If I submit my registration after the Pilgrimage roster is full, can I avoid the Wait List and participate in the Pilgrimage if I provide my own transportation and lodging?

No. When our registration is complete, you cannot participate by providing your own transportation and lodging. You cannot circumvent the Pilgrimage Wait List.

Section 1: Registration – Procedures and Form (Continued)

14. Do you allow groups to attend?

Yes, we welcome groups. Please enter your group's name or the individuals in your group on the REGISTRATION FORM: Traveling with Family/Group. If traveling with a family/group, use the name of the family/group and/or list the names in your group. Due to the high demand for registration spaces during the past several Pilgrimages, we will not hold blocks of spaces for groups. The only way to ensure that all members of your group are able to attend the Pilgrimage, is for all group members to send in their individual registration forms with payments as soon as possible.

15. I am traveling alone. Can I attend?

Absolutely. However, if you are a pilgrim who may need special attention because of medical reasons, you must include the name and contact information on the Registration Form: SPECIAL NEEDS, and Registration Form: EMERGENCY INFORMATION of someone who is also attending the Pilgrimage and who has agreed to assist you.

16. If I am of advanced age, do I need to travel with a companion?

Yes. We all know octogenarians and nonagenarians who are high functioning, independent individuals. However, in considering other pilgrimage attendees, we require individuals who are 85 years of age or above to travel with a family member or friend who has the ability to manage care and transportation in case of a medical emergency.

Section 2: Payment and Registration Grant

17. What forms of payment do you accept for registration?

Pilgrimage registration payment is by check only. Do not use the Paypal account to pay for registration fees. The Paypal account was created for donations to the preservation of Tule Lake Segregation Center.

18. Will you be providing registration grants for students and fixed-income individuals who wish to attend?

Yes, we will award a limited number of registration grants to offset the registration fee. Applicants should submit a Registration Fee Grant Application stating the need and reasons for attendance. All grant recipients will be required to provide assistance in the Sales Room, as an elder assistant, or whenever and wherever needs may arise. If you are a Tule Lake survivor over 80 years of age, you are exempt from any work assignment, unless you want to volunteer.

Section 3: Buses/Transportation

19. Once I register for the Pilgrimage, can I change my departure location?

Possibly; it will depend on space availability on the bus leaving from your desired departure location. Please note: we will not accept any bus location change requests after **May 15, 2020**.

20. Can I depart from one departure location and return to a different location?

Possibly, but there are no guarantees. Those who wish to depart on one bus and return on another may do so **ONLY** if there is space on the bus you are requesting. In effect, we must hold two seats open in order to fulfill your request. These requests for different departure and return locations will be noted. You will be informed as soon as we can if we can accommodate your special request. It will be your responsibility to make your travel plans to coordinate with your assigned bus. Please indicate your request on the REGISTRATION FORM: Additional Information.

21. Can I drive to the Pilgrimage instead of traveling on one of the buses?

Yes. However, we strongly recommend you travel with your fellow pilgrims on one of our buses. Sharing personal stories and hearing from others is a large part of the Pilgrimage experience. If you plan to drive, please indicate your plans on the REGISTRATION FORM: Additional Information, as special arrangements must be made. **You must arrive at Oregon Institute of Technology no later than 5:00 pm July 3, 2020.** Please note that all those who drive will be required to pay the full registration fee to be assured a seat on the bus for the program tours. RV parking is not allowed at OIT.

22. Is there parking for the weekend at the bus locations?

Because of the limited parking, we suggest that you make arrangements to be dropped off and picked up at your assigned bus location. We have made limited parking arrangements at some of the bus locations for the weekend. At Sacramento Airport, you will pay and park in the long-term parking lot. In San Francisco, you will be able to pay and park at the Japanese Center Parking Garage. The Berkeley location is a BART station. We may or may not have arranged parking there. At the San Jose, Sacramento Betsuin, and Union City locations, you may be able to park in the church parking lots. Parking waivers will be provided. Parking for the Washington and Oregon bus locations may be at a shopping center. Parking at the arranged lots is at your own expense, limited, and at your own risk. Parking waivers will be included in the information packet that we will send to you by June 2020.

Section 4: Housing

23. At OIT, how many people reside in a room or a suite?

OIT Dormitories in the Residence Halls: Two to a room. If you wish to name a preferred roommate, please enter on the REGISTRATION FORM: PREFERRED ROOMMATE'S NAME(S).

Village Apartments: The Village Apartments have suites with three, four and five bedrooms. Each bedroom holds ONLY one person each. All attendees (except infants) will have an assigned room, including minor children.

24. What amenities do the various housing options have? Are there elevators?

OIT Dorms: These dorms are not air conditioned, and the showers and restrooms are communal, by gender. The building is equipped with elevators for those who are unable to use stairs. If you have a mobility issues, please make a note on the REGISTRATION FORM so that we can make an accommodation by assigning you a room near the elevator and/or restroom.

Village Apartments (VA): The VA units are modular-apartment style dorms with multiple single bedrooms, two full bathrooms, a sitting area/living room, and an unfurnished kitchen. See the Village Apartment Request Form for the floor plan. The VA has air conditioning, **but no elevators**. If you have mobility problems or other disabilities, check the Village Apartment Request Form for first floor housing. We will do our best to reserve the first floor for attendees with special needs, but we usually have more first floor requests than available rooms. If you want housing in the Village Apartments, please send your registration package, Village Apartment Request Form, and payments in immediately. The Village Apartments are in high demand and fill up very quickly. The number of VA units available depend on OIT's summer-student occupancy.

25. Will other people be assigned to my assigned Village Apartment?

The Village Apartments contain three-, four- and five-bedroom suites with two shared bathrooms. Unless you are in a family or group who have requested a Village Apartment, you will share the apartment with other attendees.

26. Is there any extra cost for Village Apartments housing?

Yes, \$75 **per person**.

27. If I stay in the OIT dorms, can I get a single room?

Yes, for an additional \$50 charge per person. Please indicate this on your REGISTRATION FORM: Check box \$50: Single Occupancy Dormitory Fee.

Section 4: Housing (Continued)

28. Are there any hotels close to OIT?

Shilo Inn: A hotel close to the campus. Tule Lake Pilgrimage attendees should ask for the Pilgrimage group rate. There will be limited shuttle service to and from OIT on a schedule to be announced. Note: Hotel charges are in addition to the registration fee and are your responsibility. There is no refund or reduced Pilgrimage registration rate for those who opt to stay at the Shilo Inn.

Section 5: Special Needs

29. If I have special medical needs, should I indicate this on my registration form?

Yes, please indicate any medical need(s) you want us to know. Persons who require special medical and/or other assistance must attend with someone who can provide such assistance. Please provide the name(s) and their contact information of any caregiver(s) who will accompany you on the REGISTRATION FORM: Special Needs Assistant. We will try to provide volunteers for basic tasks (e.g. carrying luggage, priority seating, assistance getting on and off the buses, etc.). However, we do not have the sufficient volunteers to provide more intensive care (e.g., medication administration, help with bathing/bathroom visits, individual attention throughout the Pilgrimage, etc.).

30. Will there be vegetarian/vegan/gluten-free food options at the Pilgrimage?

The meals provided will have vegetarian/vegan/gluten-free options to the best of our abilities at a separate buffet table. If you have these and/or other dietary needs, please let us know to see if we can satisfy your needs. The OIT caterer will make a limited number of servings to accommodate the attendees' dietary needs for ONLY those attendees that noted it on the REGISTRATION FORM: SPECIAL NEEDS. We suggest you bring some snacks and food if we cannot satisfy your dietary needs. There will be no discount in your registration fee if we are unable to accommodate your dietary need.

31. Will refrigerators be available in the Village Apartments/OIT Dorms?

Yes. Each Village Apartment unit has an unfurnished kitchen, including a refrigerator. If you are staying in the OIT Dormitories and have medical needs for a refrigerator, please be sure to request a refrigerator on the REGISTRATION FORM: SPECIAL NEEDS, as they do NOT come standard to each dorm room. Refrigerators are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis.

Section 6: Other Activities and Miscellaneous Questions

32. The registration package includes the “Castle Rock Hike”. What is this?

The Castle Rock hike is an OPTIONAL and challenging 2.5-mile hike to a 4,000-foot elevation peak. There is an 800-foot climb to the top that is dusty and unshaded and with loose rocks. The view overlooks the Tule Lake Basin and the original land of the concentration camp site. A bus designated for the hike will be waiting for you in the parking lot at 6:30 AM on July 4, 2020. You will be provided a bag breakfast since you will be leaving before breakfast is served in the Student Union. The hike is not recommended for anyone who is not in excellent physical condition or children under the age of 10 or those with pre-existing medical conditions that might put you at risk under strenuous physical conditions. You should not have any physical or medical conditions that could lead to dizziness, fainting, cardiac events, falls or other injury. Anyone who is not in excellent physical condition, will not be permitted on the hike as medical attention in case of emergency will not be readily available. 33. How do I sign up for the Castle Rock hike?

To sign up for this hike, please complete the Castle Rock Hike Waiver and Release of Liability Form. If you do not sign up in advance, you may be able to sign up during the bus ride going up to the Pilgrimage. Your Bus Monitor will be able to tell you if there is still available space. Anyone without proper walking/hiking shoes (with Vibram-type soles and ankle support), or who is not in reasonably good physical condition, **will not** be permitted on the hike. Hikers should pair up with a buddy to help and assist each other. Please carry your medical insurance information and other pertinent medical information during the hike in your TLP bag. 34. Are there any additional costs that may be imposed? Will I need to bring any money, checks or credit cards on the Pilgrimage?

From the time you board the Tule Lake Pilgrimage bus through the entire Pilgrimage until you step off the bus four days later, there are no additional charges. If you lose or misplace your housing key, you will be charged \$35 by OIT.

There will be a Sales Room where T-shirts, books, art and other miscellaneous items presented by the Tule Lake Committee and other attendees will be for sale. Cash and checks will be accepted. Some vendors, but not all, may take credit cards. In addition, the OIT student union and other businesses may be open during a portion of the Pilgrimage.

The Student Union has a snack bar and drinks that is open at various times.

Gratuities for the OIT food service staff will be accepted for their outstanding service. If you would like to show your appreciation, we will provide the avenues to collect these tips and present them to the appropriate people. Gratuities for the bus drivers are included in your registration fees. Donations can be made during the Pilgrimage to support Tule Lake preservation efforts and if open, the museum at the Fairgrounds.
